STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Applicants who have not attended class have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement at any time. Applicants who have attended class retain the right to cancel the enrollment agreement through attendance at the first class session or midnight of the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. "Attended" is defined as attendance in the classroom. "Enrollment" is defined as execution of an enrollment agreement.

If a Notice of Cancellation is submitted prior to midnight of the third business day following the date the enrollment agreement was signed, the applicant will receive a refund of all monies paid, including the non-refundable application fee. If a Notice of Cancellation is submitted following this period, but no later than through attendance at the first class session or midnight of the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later, the applicant will receive a refund of all monies paid, less the non-refundable application fee or registration or administration fee, not to exceed \$150, and less any deduction for books and equipment not returned in good condition. The school will issue all refunds within forty-five (45) days of the date the written notification of cancellation is received by the Registrar.

The Notice of Cancellation must be submitted in writing and signed by the applicant. The signed Notice must be delivered to California University of Management of Sciences, Office of Registrar, 721 N. Euclid St, Anaheim, CA 92801. The Notice of Cancellation may be mailed or hand-delivered. The written notice, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement. Verbal cancellations or failure to attend class after the first class session are not acceptable notices of cancellation. The cancellation will be effective the date it is received in the Registrar's office if hand delivered, or the date post-marked if mailed.

Definitions

¹“Number of Students Who Began Program” means the number of students who began the program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.

²“Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.

³“Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.

⁴“On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.

⁵“150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).

⁶“150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.

⁷“Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

“Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

⁸“Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

⁹“Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

“Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.

¹⁰“No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Applicants who have not attended class have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement at any time. Applicants who have attended class retain the right to cancel the enrollment agreement through attendance at the first class session or midnight of the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. "Attended" is defined as attendance in the classroom. "Enrollment" is defined as execution of an enrollment agreement.

If a Notice of Cancellation is submitted prior to midnight of the third business day following the date the enrollment agreement was signed, the applicant will receive a refund of all monies paid, including the non-refundable application fee. If a Notice of Cancellation is submitted following this period, but no later than through attendance at the first class session or midnight of the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later, the applicant will receive a refund of all monies paid, less the non-refundable application fee or registration or administration fee, not to exceed \$150, and less any deduction for books and equipment not returned in good condition. The school will issue all refunds within forty-five (45) days of the date the written notification of cancellation is received by the Registrar.

The Notice of Cancellation must be submitted in writing and signed by the applicant. The signed Notice must be delivered to California University of Management of Sciences, Office of Registrar, 721 N. Euclid St, Anaheim, CA 92801. The Notice of Cancellation may be mailed or hand-delivered. The written notice, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement. Verbal cancellations or failure to attend class after the first class session are not acceptable notices of cancellation. The cancellation will be effective the date it is received in the Registrar's office if hand delivered, or the date post-marked if mailed.
